< About Taiwan International Ports Corporation (TIPC) >

- TIPC is a national enterprise that is wholly owned by the Ministry of Transportation and Communications (MOTC), established on March 1st, 2012.
- Upon its establishment, TIPC took over the port operation and management functions of the four Harbor Bureaus, (Keelung, Taichung, Kaohsiung, and Hualien) from MOTC.
- TIPC administers the four subsidiary organizations of the Port of Keelung, Port of Taichung, Port of Kaohsiung, and Port of Hualien and manages all aspects of the business of these ports, their associated facilities, and their auxiliary ports.

As a leading part of Japanese ICHs(*), YKIP will continue enhancing the network with ports overseas.

*ICHs (International Container Hubs): A National Strategic Policy promoted by the Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism(MLIT).
